

Gaining Momentum for a Safer Burwash - Update from the 'Outsiders'



Thanks to all the input from residents, the Parish Council have recently commissioned and funded an independent viability study on how to make our High Street a safer place. At the end of October the Outsiders joined members of the Parish Council on a walk-about of our village danger hot-spots with the engineer. Together we were able to discuss the concerns raised by residents, and consider a combination of traffic calming and safety measures. These include constructing 'gates' at the outer edges of the village; a pedestrian crossing in the centre of the village; and the possibility of bollards and/or road narrowing 'chicanes' at both the western 'pinch-point', and outside St Bartholomew's to further slow cars and aid safe crossing within the village. The engineer is due to produce a draft report for the Parish Council which will form the basis of a wider consultation with residents across the parish. We look forward to notifying you about this and other plans, and will arrange a meeting to capture your views before decisions are made and action taken.

Together with the Parish Council, the Outsiders are also planning a road safety awareness week for Spring 2019. Everyone will be invited to get involved. Planning begins in January.
